Born in Jamaica, N.Y., on March 3, 1944, Jim was the son of Salvatore and Frances Moreno, of Pleasantville, N.Y. After graduation from the College, he served as a first lieutenant in Vietnam in the army and then went on to Fordham University School of Law where he earned his J.D. in 1972.

Jim attended Pleasantville High School and was a 1962 graduate of Deerfield Academy where, in addition to playing soccer and squash, he worked on the school paper. At Dartmouth, where he majored in history, Jim played freshman golf, soccer, and squash. As some of his classmates will recall, graduation week found the good-natured Moreno holding on for dear life to the wet end of a towel as he was dragged up and down the pool in Alumni Gym to pass the College's 50-yard swimming requirement. He was blessed in life with a ready grin, deep-seated integrity, and an irrepressible sense of humor.

In addition to his parents, Jim is survived by his wife, Laura Treadway, two daughters, Amy Frances and Andrea Cole, and one son, Paul Treadway, all of Chappaqua; and two sisters, Betty See of Windsor, N.Y., and Nancy Bush of Dolgeville, N.Y. 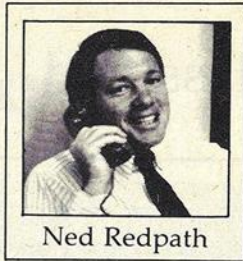
